CONCEPTS AND PRINCIPLES CONSULATION

HIGH LEVEL FINDINGS

BACKGROUND

From December 2017 to March 2018 we ran a public consultation on a series of concepts and principles we are exploring as part of our Education Strategic Review.

The responses to this consultation will help us ensure we develop workable and robust proposals for the future of optical education. We want to ensure our requirements effectively support students to become confident new practitioners who communicate well with others, and who can effectively adapt to working in teams and autonomously in a range of practice settings. This will enable them to deliver established and new services as the needs of patients change.


The consultation considered 11 concepts and principles and comprised 21 questions.

WHAT WE HEARD

We received **36** responses to the consultation – **10** from individuals and **26** from organisations. Here we report on the findings from the four multiple choice questions included in the consultation. The individual and organisational responses have been grouped together by question.


We have also commissioned some independent analysis of all of the feedback from the consultation and will publish a full analysis report separately.

New education standards



97% agreed with the concept of the GOC developing new Education Standards for optometrists and dispensing opticians (based on 33 responses to this question)

Linked to professional standards



84% agreed with the GOC informing our education requirements with our professional standards (based on 32 responses to this question)



Early clinical experience



82% agreed with the concept of embedding clinical elements of education and training progressively from the start (based on 28 responses to this question)

National registration exam



81% agreed with the concept of a national registration exam for optometrists and dispensing opticians (based on 26 responses to this question)
